Marta was recently asked to share her years of knowledge and experience with the Interior Architecture (IARC) students at UNCG.

The IARC program states: "We share with interior design a fundamental interest in human and environmental relationships. Yet because these relationships are affected by objects as well as the architectural context, we also study the design of building forms and systems and provide facilities, tools, and equipment for students to build what they design – an approach to design education that is more typical of schools of design or architecture. The focus on the design and development of interior space depends upon knowledge of materials, finishes, furnishings, manufactured objects and products, buildings, context, human behavior, and human development".

Marta's comments focused on the technical aspects of Interior Design; the critical skills required to be a great designer; and she shared her knowledge gained from decades of managing a successful design business.

She also documented several projects, so that students could see the entire process from conception to completion. Seeing photos and the challenges involved in each project, generated many questions from this smart, passionate, and engaged class of talented students.



Marta believes that it is really important to give back, and to mentor to students. MMID (Marta Mitchell Interior Design) has an active Internship program, and typically has 3 Interns annually, from local Universities. This gives students the ability to work on real life projects in a busy firm.
